

**Class Introductions-ḥiškʷiiʔath**  
**Mentor-Apprentice for the Classroom**

**Teacher Resources:** *A fluent speaker in the classroom will be your resource before and during the exercise. \*Brief the fluent speaker on what you are planning before class.*

**Aim:** *The classroom will pay attention to how the fluent speaker introduces people.*

**Teachers asks:** **ʔačaqḥ** – *Who is that? (motioning toward each of the students, one at a time, until all students are named).*

**Fluent speaker responds:** **ʔukłaaʔiṣ** \_\_\_\_\_ - *He/she is called \_\_\_\_\_ .*

Key phrases to ask for fluent speaker assistance:

**ʔaʔaquuʔathʔaał** – *How do you say \_\_\_\_\_?*

**ʔuuʔuukʷaʔathaʔi-** *Speak your (own) language.*

**huʔaasʔi waa-** *Say it again.*

**ʔaaqinaphs-** *What am I doing?*

**ʔaqaqḥ ʔahkuu-** *What is this?*

Follow up exercises:

- a. *Have students write and place their names in a draw. Students then take turns standing up together and publicly introducing the person they've drawn.*
- b. *Have students write and place their names in a draw. Students assume the name they draw and they get introduced by that name. For the duration of class, they ask each other **ʔačaqḥ**- *Who is that?* and **ʔačaqḥs**- *Who am I?* They mark a point for themselves each time someone answers with the wrong name.*
- c. *Establish a daily routine where students take a daily shift, announcing the arrival/welcoming of each student by name, **hintšilʔiṣ** \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_ has arrived. Introduce additional vocabulary, such as **naawahiniṣ** \_\_\_\_\_ - *We are waiting for \_\_\_\_\_.**
